Conditional Uses., Item K. to add Haywood Road to the list of thoroughfares permitting professional offices in the R-3 District adjacent to commercial and industrial zones. Commission unanimously recommended this amendment to City Council. This ordinance was read on first reading on May 17, 1988 and on second reading on May 24, 1988.

# A. Formal presentation of City of Asheville Budget for

# Fiscal Year 1988-89 and scheduling public hearing for June 14, 1988.

The City Manager highlighted the 1988-89 Budget message.

Councilman Price moved to schedule a public hearing for

the City of Asheville Budget for Fiscal Year 1988-89 for June 14, 1988. This motion was seconded by Vice-Mayor Michalove and carried unanimously.

# B. Ordinance No. 1690 - Ordinance for the levy and

#### collection of business license taxes.

Mayor Bissette said the Revenue Ordinance has been

rewritten to make it simpler and easier to understand, easier to administer and more equitable in levy. He said a phase-in process has been incorporated into the proposed ordinance.

The City Manager said the ordinance was rewritten to

provide growth in revenues, equity, and efficiency in administering the ordinance. He said several businesses expressed a concern about the confidentiality of the gross sales receipts. He said language was included in the ordinance to provide that gross sales receipts would be confidential.

Ralph Bishop, speaking in opposition to the

ordinance, said he felt the ordinance was only a measure to cut into the profits of businesses in the City of Asheville.

Councilman Price moved for the adoption of Ordinance

No. 1690. This motion was seconded by Councilman Martin.

On a roll call vote of 6-0, Ordinance No. 1690

passed on first reading.

# C. Resolution No. 88-87 - Resolution authorizing the Mayor

# to execute a contract on behalf of the City of Asheville with American Red Cross for handicapped transportation

#### services.

Mayor Bissette said as a recipient of Section 9

funds from the Urban Mass Transportation Act the City is required to provide public transportation services within the corporate limits to qualified handicapped individuals. The service may be provided by the Asheville Transit Authority through the use of a third party. The American Red Cross is

willing to provide this service.

Debra Collins, American Red Cross representative,

answered questions from members of Council.

Councilman Boland requested that the city staff check

with other cities to gather data on how they deal with requirements from the Urban Mass Transportation.

Carl Ownbey, from the Asheville Transit Authority, said

this information is being collected and should be available by next year.

# COUNCILMAN BOLAND - PROPOSED ELECTION OF ASHEVILLE CITY SCHOOL BOARD MEMBERS

Councilman Boland reported that he had attended a controversial meeting relative to a proposal to elect Asheville City School Board members rather than having them appointed. He said the League of Women Voters would be studying this proposal within the next year. He said citizens expressed concern about the accountability of the members to Council and the public and

the process used in appointing members.

## WATER PROBLEMS - PATTON MOUNTAIN AND PEACH KNOB RESERVOIRS

The City Manager reported that the water problems experienced in the Patton Mountain and Peach Knob reservoir areas are currently under evaluation. He said the city staff is in the process of setting up automatic mutual aid for fire protection with the Volunteer Fire Departments, as well as placing sanitized water tanks in the neighborhoods for individuals without water. He said it is being recommended that everyone conserve water as much as possible.
