A. Resolution No. 89-28 - Resolution stating the intent of

the City of Asheville to consider the annexation of an area known as Skyland II and fixing the date of a public hearing on the question of annexation.

Mayor Bissette said pursuant to Part 3 of Article 4A of

Chapter 160A of the N. C. General Statutes, the City of Asheville has examined certain areas to determine if they qualify for annexation. By Resolution No. 87-99, adopted June 2, 1987, the City of Asheville identified the Skyland II area as being under consideration for annexation. A report of the plans for extending services to said territory will be available for public inspection in the City Clerk's Office. A legible map of the area to be annexed and a list of persons holding freehold interest in property in the area will be posted in the City Clerk's Office. This resolution will set the date of the public hearing for 4:00 P.M. on April

18, 1989, in the Asheville Civic Center Banquet Room.

By the use of a map, Patty Tallerday with the

Planning Department, outlined the area proposed to be annexed.

Michalove, Resolution No. 89-29 was unanimously adopted.

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C. Resolution No. 89-30 - Resolution authorizing the City

Manager to enter into an encroachment agreement with Peter D. Williams and Kathy M. Williams for encroachment on Westchester Drive.

Mayor Bissette said certain improvements on property

owned by Mr. and Mrs. Williams encroach upon the right-of-way for the City of Asheville on Westchester Drive. This encroachment was made in error and was unintentional. This resolution will authorize the City Manager to execute an encroachment agreement by and between the City of Asheville and Peter D. Williams and his wife, Kathy M. Williams, for encroachments on the right-of-way for Westchester Drive.

Upon motion of Councilman York, seconded by Councilman

Price, Resolution No. 89-30 was unanimously adopted.

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® D. Consideration of Preliminary Subdivision Plat -

Sherwood Heights Extension - located on Elk Mountain Scenic Highway.

Mayor Bissette said the Asheville Planning and Zoning

Commission on February 12, 1989, reviewed and approved the preliminary plat of Sherwood Heights Extension, subject to the following contingencies:

- 1. City Council granting a variance from City subdivision street grade standards of 12% to 18%;
- 2. NCDOT approval of connection to Elk Mountain Scenic Highway;
- 3. Compliance with Erosion Control Ordinance; and
- 4. Provision of sufficient water pressure to support

fire protection.

Tom Elmore with the Planning Department said this

project is a 16 lot subdivision and is an extension of an existing subdivision. He presented maps showing the proposed extension of this subdivision. He said the Planning and Zoning Commission approved the preliminary plat contingent upon the City Council granting a variance from the roadway standards in the subdivision ordinance of a 12% street grade to a 18% grade. He said the Public Works Department reviewed the proposed street and recommended that the 12% street grade be met.

Gary Davis, with McGill Associates, Engineers for

the site development, speaking in support of Council granting the street grade variance, showed several maps and outlined alternatives as to the reason the variance is requested. He explained the pros and cons of each alternative that was considered.

Chief John Rukavina, Asheville Fire Department,

recommended that the 12% street grade standard be met. He said the fire trucks are not built to deal with an 18% grade and this would cause a definite problem.

After discussion, Vice-Mayor Michalove moved to

table action on the preliminary plat until March 7, 1989 giving members of Council an opportunity to visit the site in question. This motion was seconded by Councilman Price and carried unanimously.
