The following topics were raised by residents and addressed by City Council and City staff: appeal from Kenilworth neighborhood for assistance in finding a way to delay the MSD Project (to upgrade a sewer line in their neighborhood from 12" to 24") in order for the neighborhood to find alternatives to help save the lake, trees and property values in the area; growth of the City is being borne at the expense of the current residents; Merrimon Avenue traffic and possible plans for the future; noise from car stereos; litter; need for speed humps on Lakeshore Drive to curb speeding; speeding on Kimberly Avenue; problems with lighting at Weaver Park; need for a park in North Asheville; need to proceed with the Richmond Hill Project; would Council support bringing up the Parks, Recreation and Greenways Bond issue again in November, 1999; concerns regarding the Asheville Mall expansion - traffic, noise, buffer, lighting, etc.; need for equitable enforcement of noise ordinance for residents and businesses; need for cruising law, especially in Flint Street and Starnes Avenue area; need for sidewalk on section between Larchmont Road and Fenner Avenue; need for dilapidated house at 26 Fenner Avenue to be torn down; and consideration of closing White Pine Drive to Tunnel Road and finding another route for White Pine Drive to exit onto Kenilworth Drive.
